Do you like to pore over older, well-read books? Are you looking for something special in your area of interest-whether it is history, the arts, cooking, sports or current fiction? Or are you simply looking for some "good reads" for those long winter evenings? Whatever your interests, be sure and plan to attend the up-coming Fall Sale on October 4, 5 and 6.

We have several books on Native Americans including VOLUME II OF THE ANNUAL REPORTS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR; INDIAN AFFAIRS AND TERRITORIES published in 1910. This volume contains four fold-out maps: a map of United States of America Indian reservations, and maps of the territories of Arizona, New Mexico, and Alaska showing Indian reservations, Military reserves, Forest reserves and private land.

Book VI of local author Jory Sherman's Rivers West series: ARKANSAS RIVERS. This is a paperback edition.

THE PURPLE PARASOL written by George McCutcheon and published in 1904. This volume contains four lovely Harrison Fisher prints.

WESTPORT: GATEWAY TO THE EARLY WEST by Louis Honig published in 1950. This is a privately printed history of the stepping-off point to the West. This book contains photographs of Westport in the 1850's and names and descriptions of early settlers of Westport. Kansas City is the successor to Westport.

ART INDIO is a book of Indian and Eskimo art in Canada. This book is printed in four languages: English, German, Spanish, and French. Pages 27 to 37 contain the English translation. It includes many pages of photographs of Eskimo and Indian artifacts.
