Congratulations are in order for all who helped make our book sale such a success during National Library Week. Sixty-three volunteers worked 219.5 hours the week of the sale which included set-up on Wednesday through the sale days until clean-up on Saturday afternoon. But our thanks extends beyond these special people to all of those who donated books throughout the year. Without your donations we would not have such a good selection of books to offer. Book Sleuths work every Monday to sort and price books, select those for the showcases and others we want to highlight at the time of the sale.

We realized over \$6000.00 from book sales, membership renewals and/or new memberships as well as other donations and sales of miscellaneous items. We were pleased that the Lewis and Clark Journals brought \$388. at auction. Chuck Speice was the high bidder.

Following the sale, thirty-six boxes of books were returned to our storage building as "seed" books for the fall sale. This is fewer than one thousand books now on hand, so we continue to encourage and welcome your donations.

The library staff is supportive of our efforts in spite of any disruptions we may cause as we move books from one place to another and they often call to our attention any special donations which have come in. It is through our sales that we are able to support programs of the Boone County Library. Each year we provide \$10,000 for the purchase of non-fiction titles, with each book containing a special sticker identifying the year of purchase. Through this project we also honor our volunteers and others who make special contributions by placing his or her name in the front of a book.

As you enter the library, check out the nook on your right, identified as HONOR BOOKS. This area contains the books which were purchased last year. Soon they will be replaced with newly purchased books for the 2009 year.
