Friends of the Library, Boone County (FOLBC) Year 2012 Annual Report to the Membership January 2012 through December 2012

Friends of the boone county library (folbc) is an all volunteer 501(C) 3 organization. Our charter is to enhance library. To this end, we have had another successful year.

Highlights follow:

- FOLBC continues to advertise library services and materials through the Bookplate, our informative newsletter, the <u>www.folbc.org</u> website and word of mouth.
- FOLBC has supported the Boone County Library (BCL) directly with over \$30,000, including \$19,500 toward the new library heating, ventilation and air-conditioning system and the FOLBC newsletter.
- FOLBC purchased *online* (available at home) reference materials such as HeritageQuest® Online, providing patrons access to considerable genealogical data, and LAWCHEK® which provides forms associated with all areas of the law. LAWCHEK® also provides an introduction to the law and many links for additional study. These are available through the Boone County Library website www.boonecountylibrary.org through the Genealogy or Reference links.
- FOLBC purchased approximately \$8,500 of books to enhance the quality and currency of the library collection.
- FOLBC continued and enhanced our outreach efforts by delivering books to the homebound, reading to day school tots, and providing, with various donors' help, small collections of books at all Boone County Head Start and ABC day schools that parents can check out. Since its inception in 2008 at six day schools, it has grown to now service seventeen classes. As of the end of 2012, over 3,245 checkouts had occurred, and FOLBC now distributes over 600 books.
- FOLBC continues to honor those who have donated over \$25 or who
 have donated any amount of labor with a book in their honor added to
 the BCL collection. These Honor Books are included in the \$8,500 book
 purchase mentioned above.
- FOLBC, with every project, creates added value. The Book Sleuths evaluate all donated books and price according to value. This has kept our book sale revenue growing.
- Book sales [Spring, Fall, Holiday, Silent Auction, Trolley, and Children's] continue to be our primary revenue source, approximately 70 percent.
- FOLBC undertakes unusual projects from time to time. This year, for a
 fund-raiser, the removal and sale of a bank vault door was attempted
 with success. (The Boone County Library building was once a bank.)
 The removal required about 24 hours and the sale was for \$2,200. This
 was truly an added value project; otherwise, it would have cost for
 removal.
- Memberships represent well over 1000 supporters, 300 of which are life members, that have donated over 2400 hours, the majority of which were contributed by the 12 working board members. According to the Corporation for National and Community Service, this 2400 hours translates to over \$50,000.


Holiday Sale 2012

Useful, Practical Help

And did we mention free? Among the many benefits the Friends organization provides to our local library patrons are two very valuable online reference materials, LAWCHEK® and HeritageQuest® Online. LAWCHEK® was born of necessity and can be a great tool when one is faced with a legal need. Heritage Quest is geared more toward fun and provides a comprehensive treasury of American genealogical sources for every level of family history afficionado. Both can be accessed for free at the library or from your computer/device at http://boonecountylibrary.org/.



LAWCHEK® is a user-friendly reference product designed for both the layperson and the attorney, offering simple answers to everyday legal questions. Currently, it covers eleven areas (or disciplines) of the law: Bankruptcy, Contracts, Corporations, Criminal Law, Domestic/Family Law, Education, Intellectual Properties (Patents, Copyrights, Trademarks), Landlord/Tenant, Real Estate, Trial/Litigation, and Wills/Estates. In each of the eleven areas you can access state-specific information from either Help Guides or a Forms section. In addition,

a Glossary of common legal terms is provided, as well as various links to websites where you can get information and forms for both Federal and State Taxes.

To access LAWCHEK® go to the library website referenced above and click on Reference Databases in the center of the tabs at the top of the page. Then from the pull-down menu click on Legal/Business Info.

HERITAGE QUEST'ONLINE

HeritageQuest® Online delivers an essential collection of genealogical and historical sources—with coverage dating back to the 1700s—that can help people find their ancestors and discover a place's past.

The collection consists of six core data sets: U.S. Federal Censuses, Genealogy and local history books, Periodical Source Index (PERSI), Revolutionary War records, Freedman's Bank Records, and LexisNexis U.S. Serial Set.

U.S. Federal Censuses feature the original images of every extant federal census in the United States, from 1790 through 1930, with name indexes for many decades. In total the collection covers more than 140 million names.

Genealogy and local history books deliver more than 7 million digitized page images from over 28,000 family histories, local histories, and other books. Titles have been digitized from our own renowned microform collections, as well from the American Antiquarian Society via an exclusive partnership.

Periodical Source Index (PERSI), published by the Allen County Public Library, is recognized as the most comprehensive index genealogy and local history periodicals. It contains more than 2 million records covering titles published around the world since 1800.

Revolutionary War records contains original images from pension and bounty land warrant application files help to identify more than 80,000 American Army, Navy, and Marine officers and enlisted men from the Revolutionary War era.

Freedman's Bank Records, with more than 480,000 names of bank applicants, their dependents, and heirs from 1865–1874, offers valuable data that can provide important clues to tracing African American ancestors prior to and immediately after the Civil War.

LexisNexis U.S. Serial Set records the memorials, petitions, private relief actions made to the U.S. Congress back to 1789, with a total of more than 480,000 pages of information.

To access HeritageQuest Online you will need your library card barcode

To access Heritage Quest from home you need a pre-authorized Boone County library card. Click on the Genealogy tab at the top of the home page. Scroll down to Heritage Quest Online and click on the logo bar. You will then be prompted to enter the ID number on the back of your library card. Instructions are provided on how to get your card pre-authorized.
