Special Meeting

A special meeting of the Friends of the Library, Boone County, Arkansas, Inc. will be held Tuesday, June 24, at 5:00pm in the upstairs meeting room at our library. All FOL members are requested to attend for the purpose of voting on the amended Constitution and By-laws of our organization. The changes basically move the information about membership contributions from the Constitution over to the By-Laws. Please attend this important meeting.

Proposed changes:

Constitution - Article IV will be changed. It currently reads -

Annual membership contributions shall be receivable in the Friends of the Library Trust Fund on or before January 1 of each year for the 12 succeeding months. The officers may create, at their discretion, other appropriate categories of membership, and they may accept books or other material needed by the Library in lieu of contributions in cash. All contributions to the Friends of the Library Trust Fund and gifts of materials to the Library are tax-deductible.

New wording

Membership contributions shall be receivable in the Friends of the Library Trust Fund. The officers may create, at their discretion, appropriate categories of membership and they may accept books and other material needed by the Library in lieu of contributions in cash. All contributions to the Friends of the Library Trust Fund and gifts of materials to the Library are tax-deductible.

By-Laws – The following will be added:

Article I MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. Any person or association interested in the objectives of this Corporation shall be eligible for membership upon the payment of dues, as stipulated:

A Letter From our Outgoing Library Director

I began my journey at the Boone County Library in October 2007 as a part-time librarian in the Children's Department. From the very beginning, I found joy in connecting with young readers and creating a warm, engaging space for learning. On January 1, 2009, I transitioned to a full-time role as the Children's Librarian—a position that allowed me to take the lead on all story times, including visits to local preschools and the development of our now highly attended toddler program.

During those years, we brought stories to life through author and illustrator visits, launched a beloved doggie partner reading program—where the comforting presence of nonjudgmental pups encouraged reluctant readers—and hosted whimsical events like teddy bear tea picnics and tie-dye t-shirt days. Each program was created with love and purpose, helping foster a lifelong love of reading in our community's children.

In April 2012, the administrative board approached me with the opportunity to serve as Interim Director. I accepted, and what I thought might be temporary turned into a deeply fulfilling new chapter. Over the past 13 years, the library has undergone remarkable growth and transformation. We renovated our public restrooms, installed new flooring, added a 3D printer and wireless printing, remodeled our annex, created two new meeting rooms, and added a dedicated space downstairs where children can play while parents check out materials. We've also reorganized sections throughout the library to better serve our patrons—and the list goes on.

Saying goodbye is definitely bittersweet. I've built lasting friendships here and have watched children grow up—some of whom I first met during story time years ago. While I'll still be living in Harrison, I'm looking forward to spending more time with my own children and grandchildren.

I am profoundly grateful to the staff and the administrative board at Boone County Library. Their support and dedication made everything we accomplished possible. It has been an honor to serve this community, and I carry with me cherished memories and deep appreciation for the time I've spent here.

Vice President – assists the president in the day-to-day operations of the organization and fills in when necessary.

Book Sleuth – scours the internet to find the value of donated books and prices them accordingly for our sales. Is responsible for the silent auction books, book trolley and the free book shelves. The lead also maintains the storage building of books between sales.

Book Sales Coordinator – sets up book sales and takes them down afterwards. Rounds up volunteers to work.

Webpage Administrator – refreshes and keeps FOLBC.org up to date with changes and upcoming events.

Newsletter Creation and Mailings – the person that fills this position takes charge of all aspects of putting together our quarterly newsletter and distributes it via the U.S. postal service and by email.

Publicity and Promotion – advertises upcoming book sales or special events by use of local radio, the Harrison Daily Times, billboards, etc. Maintains the FOL book display case.

Membership – seeks new memberships and adds them to our database. Notifies lapsing members for renewal and updates database when members renew.

Photographer – takes pictures at our sales and special events for publishing in our newsletter or the Harrison Daily Times.



An *ex libris* (Latin for 'from the books'),^{[1][2]} also known as a **bookplate** (or **book-plate**, as it was commonly styled until the early 20th century),^[3] is a printed or decorative label pasted into a book, often on the front <u>endpaper</u>, to indicate ownership.^[4] Simple typographical bookplates are termed "book labels".^[5]

Bookplates often bear a motif relating to the book's owner, such as a <u>coat-of-</u>

<u>arms</u>, <u>crest</u>, <u>badge</u>, <u>motto</u>, or a design commissioned from an artist or designer.^{[6][7][8]} The name of the owner usually follows an inscription such as "from the books of..." or "from the library of...", or in Latin, "*ex libris*". Bookplates are important evidence for the <u>provenance</u> of books.

The most traditional technique used to make bookplates is <u>burin engraving</u>. The engraved copper matrix is then printed with an <u>intaglio press</u> on paper, and the resulting print can be pasted into the book to indicate ownership.

In the United States, bookplates replaced <u>book rhymes</u> (which replaced <u>book curses</u>) after the 19th century.^[9]
